# Water, From Top to Bottom

Gutters. That's what they do. Top to bottom. They collect water from the roof and direct it to downspouts which carry it to storm sewers at the bottom of the building's foundation and thence to city sewers. But in the case of our Lakewood Masonic Temple, they don't quite do that any more.

After nearly nine decades of service, our original copper gutters have corroded. They leak water down the sides of our building where it damages our exterior masonry. They leak water into parts of our building causing damage to interior plaster and painted decorations. These are not good things.

Taking the advice of the National Park Service's Technical Preservation Division that "uncontrolled moisture is the most prevalent cause of deterioration in older and historic buildings," The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company has decided to replace

the gutters, as original, so that they will carry water away as they were originally designed to do. This project will cost \$35,000. That's a lot more than your house? Yes, it is. But consider that the size of our building requires gutters that are much larger in dimension—and many more running feet of them. And, most importantly, our gutters are several stories in the air and accessible only by lifts or scaffolding rather than by simple extension ladder.

The Lakewood Masonic Foundation has agreed to help raise funds for this crucial historical preservation project. Your gift will help us keep rain water outside where it belongs so that our historic home can be preserved for future generations. You can use the form on page 11. # High Priest's Message

Although I am writing this article in January while an ice storm rages outside, I am warmed by the thought that by the time this article reaches you, a good portion of winter will be behind us. Every January I ask myself: WHY am I living in Ohio? Despite our bad weather in the winter months, Ohio and the Cleveland area is a great place to live because of the wonderful and generous people who live here. One of the things that makes us great is our sense of giving. Royal Arch Masons traditionally give to two charities which we should all promote and support.

#### **ROYAL ARCH RESEARCH ASSISTANCE (RARA)**

Since its conception in 1974, Royal Arch Research Assistance (RARA) has been the world's leading philanthropy dedicated to helping children with Central Auditory Processing Disorders. RARA, through the contributions of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International, supports the Center for Central Auditory Research at Colorado State University, where continuous efforts are being made to understand and treat individuals with Central Auditory Processing Disorders. What is Central Auditory Processing Disorder? Children with CAPD typically have completely normal hearing acuity and have no difficulty understanding very soft speech in quiet environments, such as a sound-proofed room. However, because of inefficiencies in their central auditory nervous system, that is, their brainstem and cortex, these children often receive auditory messages in a distorted or incomplete manner, even in minimally noisy situations. Because of their difficulty with understanding speech, these children often develop academic, emotional, and social problems. Researchers at the RARA Center for Central Auditory Research have discovered that as many as 15% to 25% of school-aged children have CAPD, and that nearly 40% will fail at least one school grade due to this disorder despite normal intelligence. Children with CAPD frequently misunderstand verbal instructions, are easily distracted or confused in minimally noisy places, and fail to perform up to their potential. In noisy environments, these children experience a listening chaos and become frustrated, underachieving students.

#### **ADOPT AMERICA NETWORK**

The Adopt America Network (AAN) places "special needs" children who are waiting for homes with permanent adoptive parents, pays for home studies so that eager parents can afford to welcome children into their homes, and coordinates a national network of volunteer adoption specialists who recruit and match families with waiting children. Just as important as the financial support that will be provided through the foundation, AAN hopes that Royal Arch Masons will provide a greater public awareness of their organization and of their mission. As we share the message of AAN, not only in our Chapters but as well in our churches, communities and civic groups, it is hoped that additional adoption specialists can be located and that new adoptive parents will come forward.

### Lessons from the Geese

Fact 1. As each goose flaps its wings it creates an uplift for birds to follow. By flying in a V formation the whole flock adds 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew alone.

**Lesson**. Masons who share a common direction and sense of community can get where we are going quicker and easier because we are traveling on the thrust of one another.

Fact 2. When a goose falls out of formation it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front of it.

**Lesson**. If we Masons have as much sense as a goose we will stay in formation following those headed in the direction for the betterment of our fraternity. We are willing to accept their help and give help to our brothers.

Fact 3. When the lead goose tires it rotates back into formation, and another goose flies in point position.

**Lesson**. As Masons it pays to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing in leadership. As with geese, Masons are interdependent on each other's skills and capabilities and unique gifts, talents and resources.

Fact 4. The geese flying in formation honk to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

**Lesson**. As brothers we all need to make sure our honking is encouraging in brotherhoods where there is encouragement. The production is much greater and the Masonic light much brighter. The power of encouragement to stand by a brother whose core values and obligations are in line with Masonry is the quality of honking we seek.
